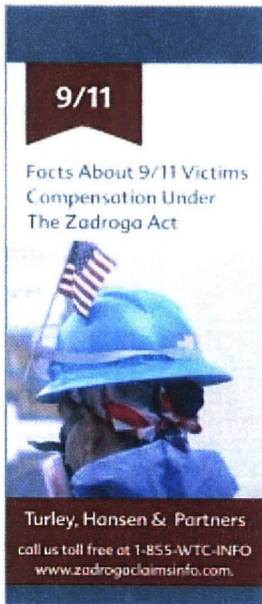


Law firm creates guide for 9/11 victims

The law firm [Turley, Redmond, Rosasco & Rosasco](#) has created its own guidebook for victims of 9/11 who became sick from toxins.

The book, "Facts About 9/11 Victims Compensation Under the Zadroga Act," provides an overview of the recently passed [James Zadroga 9/11 Health and Compensation Act of 2010](#), as well as describing who is eligible to file a claim once the fund opens this summer.

While those filing a claim do not need to retain a lawyer to do so, Turley, Redmond, Rosasco & Rosasco attorney Troy Rosasco recommends doing so.

"Proving the full extent of any individual's damages, both economic and pain and suffering, is a complicated process," Rosasco said. "Each worker will have an opportunity to go in front of a hearing officer appointed by the special master of the fund. That hearing officer almost certainly will be, and has been in the past, either an attorney or an administrative law judge, and therefore the assistance of an attorney is advised given the complexity of the claim. An individual would have a hard time in identifying on their own the full extent of the economic and pain and suffering damages were worth."

The law firm has been representing 9/11 victims since the days following the terrorist attacks on Sept. 11, 2001.
